Help Wanted: LA Division Superintendent

As some of you may already know, I spent Thanksgiving last year (and, then some) hospitalized due to complications related to Type 2 Diabetes. Or, so I thought.

As it turned out, yes, my diabetes had risen dangerously high; which a new regiment of medications has brought back under control, thank you – but a new health complication also was silently emerging, chronic heart disease. Specifically, Congestive Heart Failure.

For the last several months, I have been in-andout of hospitals and doctor offices for consultations, examinations and/or procedures. Within days of the time I am composing this report to you, I will be having a dual chamber, internal defibrillator installed. It won't cure anything, but could provide a bit of protection should I go into Sudden Cardiac Arrest.

This background, although long-winded, leads me to the point of this quarter's message: I must curtail most of my NMRA Divisional (and Regional) responsibilities — including acting as your Los Angeles (L.A.) Division Superintendent. During our monthly Advisory Board (Board) meeting, held April 13, 2023, I shared with the Board my newly recovered health issue(s) and the impact it/they might have upon you, our members. To a person attending, each offered

to "step up" and take on a bit more workload in hopes of keeping the Division alive and moving forward. I don't know the right words to express just how proud they made me feel, so I will simply say THANK YOU!

None, however, felt they possessed the skills, talents, and/or time required to assume the role of Superintendent. Therefore, our Division enters a period during which we are leaderless. This doesn't mean L.A. is going-away or will be "falling off the face of the earth" any time soon — your Board isn't ready to give up that easily! You shouldn't expect as many events, meetings, tours, surveys, etc... forthcoming either though.

As laid out in our Division's By-Laws (as well as the Region's too), Pacific Southwest Region (PSR) President Pat Raymer, Vice President Gary Butts, and Board of Directors have been notified of the position's vacancy. 

The Past Becomes the Future



It Was A Question

A question from The Model Railroads of Southern California groups.io page (groups.io/g/ModelRailroadsofSoCalif) led to a response that a new club was forming in the San Pedro area. Was it a new club that was forming or an old club relocating to a new area? A reply suggested that the responses may reflect a conflation of several not connected issues. Yes, there was an HO club in the distant vicinity and yes there was a new layout being built in the San Pedro area. Perhaps the writers were referring to the relocation of the Los Angeles Model Railroad Society from its former location in Hawthorne to its new location in Harbor City.

A Brief History of the Los Angeles Model Railroad Society (LAMRS)

The Los Angeles Model Railroad Society (LAMRS) was founded in 1971 as the Pacific Coast Train Club. In 1971 the club was approved as a California non-profit organization dedicated to benefiting the community through its members' interests in model railroading. The club's railroad is a hypothetical model operating between the Great Lakes and the Pacific, hence its name Great Lakes and Western Railroad (GL&W). The railroad has been featured twice in Model Railroader Magazine and has been included in many model railroad association tours, publications, national television shows, commercials, even a music video. 

years it was located in leased space in Hawthorne California. Unfortunately, the death of a benefactor who allowed the club to reside there under beneficial terms changed the arrangement when the building was sold to a new owner forcing the club to find a new home or pay market-level rents.

It Ain't Over Until it is Over

Rising to the challenge of "what's next", the membership weighed several options but ultimately determined it was time to find a new location. The search was guided by four key requirements. These were: 1) first floor with wheelchair access, 2) safe location, 3) available parking and 4) A/C and heating. A number of different options were evaluated, partnerships explored, and even modular layout concepts considered. Even though Covid seemed to limit the Club's efforts, the belief that "Somethings are Worth Saving" became the motivating force to overcome these obstacles. Finally, passion and persistence began to payoff.

One of our members, found a place in Harbor City that he wanted for office and storage for his business. It had 1000 ft of space he was not going to use and so the club leased it from him. It met our requirements; ground floor, HVAC, parking and a decent neighborhood, but a screwy shaped space, or that was what we thought at the time.




Ideas, concepts and discussions began to transform the "impossible" into the "possible".


Several layout design concepts were considered. That was narrowed down to three competing concepts. A years-long effort of weekly Zoom and in-person meetings enabled the membership to refine each design and to select a front-runner while the space was being prepared for tenancy. The membership voted and selected one of the designs and various work groups formed to translate vision into reality.

The unique arrangement of rooms in the building available for lease presented an opportunity to "think outside of the box". As was the case in the original layout, it was important that the layout design make it possible for easy access and viewing by both operators and the viewing public. The walk-around design features both point-to-point and continuous running, encourages active involvement in the operations of the layout, maximizes the use of the space, and provides a long mainline run! While the freelance railroad is the the *Great Lakes and Western*, the new layout focuses on the Western operations from the Sierras to the Los Angeles Harbor.

As shown in the 3-dimensional models (see pictures above), the layout is an around the room double-deck shelf layout with staging underneath part of it, connected by two helixes. The lower-level and the upper level are designed to feature both train operations and yard activities. Standard gauge operations include mainline running, logging operations and several branch lines. Narrow gauge operations on the upper level include six towns along the Rio Grande Southern (RGS).

Other design requirements include: 30" minimum main line radius and 24" minimum for branch lines and narrow gauge. Maximum grades on the whole layout are 2%. All turnouts and double crossovers are hand laid using Fast Tracks jigs, Micro Engineering code 83 rail and flex track. Digitrax DCC is used for train throttle control and LCC (Layout Command Control) is used to operate turnouts, block detection and signaling.

Creating the "New" and "Improved Great Lakes and Western Railroad

Work is underway to bring the vision of the layout into reality. Portions of the two levels have been installed and the first of the two helixes has been constructed, connecting the two levels together. Track laying progresses rapidly and the helix has already been tested.

The previous layout was very mature and was in maintenance mode for the better part of the last decade. No significant redesign projects or construction had happened on the old layout. Meanwhile, a handful of LAMRS members have their own layouts, but the vast majority do not. Couple that with implementation of LCC, a fairly new technology, multiple helixes, 3 levels, and the need to be able to move and salvage key portions of the layout should another move be necessary, and the effort to build the layout becomes exponentially more complicated.

We have had to organize ourselves by creating "workstreams" headed by those with experience and skills in that area to lead members who are just now developing those capabilities. What we find is that new challenges arise and all of us, no matter the years of experience, are learning as we go! The excitement of DOING the hobby, actively participating, has breathed new life into our members. We started with focusing on one section of the layout with the intent to get it to operational before moving to the next. This allows making mistakes, learning, adapting, and providing lessons learned for the next sections we build. Humor, frustration and patience all play a role but that seems to also bring us together as many daytime work sessions involve a group lunch at one of many local eateries.

Building a new layout provides exciting opportunities for folks interested in creating a new model railroad. The benchwork is approximately 25 percent completed. The electrical work is just beginning and ideas for scenery are being considered. Structures that have been in storage will need to be refurbished, and new structures created to complement the scenic concepts and the extensive switching areas. All of this provides a wide range of opportunities to participate in recreating the "New and Improved" Great Lakes and Western Railroad.
