Superintendent's Report

Moving Forward

An update on where things stand within the Los Angeles (L.A.) Division...

In my last quarter's report, I shared the difficulty our Division continues to labor under regarding a lack of members offering to volunteer time and support for local events, and the scheduling / administration thereof. Sadly, I have not heard back from any of our nearly 200 members. *Strike One?*

Coupled with a surge of positive COVID cases hospitalizAations attributed primarily to and AB.4 the highly communicable and AB.5 subvariants. both Ventura and 05 Angeles Counties – actually just about 100% of Southern California at the time this is being written – are on the threshold of returning to mandatory indoor mask usage requirements again. The Division's ability to hold, or support, public face-to-face events safely is greatly threatened. Strike Two?

During the July 2022 meeting of your L.A. Division Advisory Board, this latter threat was discussed at length. That is, *"If COVID* constraints prohibit us from scheduling future meets or home/club layout open houses, what might we do instead? How should we proceed?"

One idea, in particular, was met with strong enthusiasm – holding a FallRail-like event, only *virtually*. Specifically: offer a couple of live 30-40 minutes-long clinics, maybe include a videotransmitted layout tour; of course, schedule some time for members to make "show-andtell" presentations. If a bit of extra time remains, augment the event with an NMRA Library video or two. Total time of the meet: 3-4 hours. When: likely a Saturday, or Sunday?, in early November - its National Model Railroading month you know!

If you would like to present, have an additional idea or two, or want to help with this event's planning, please contact me directly; my contact information is listed throughout each issue of the *LA Coupler*.

In closing, I'm going to repeat a request from last quarter's report: **If you care about the quality/quantity of programs and services provided in your Division, please, step up now!** I truly believe there are at least a couple of you who want to keep the Division going too. Or, are we looking at *Strike Three*?

As always, I welcome your thoughts or comments.

Have you signed up for the biggest model railroading event of 2022 right here in San Diego? The Pacific Southwest Region (PSR) presents its annual convention this year hosted by the San Diego Division. This year's convention will take place at the Four Points Hotel by Sheraton centrally located in the Kearney Mesa area.

Our Convention Committee has worked very hard to provide a fun filled week of model railroading enjoyment. Attendees will be able to participate in many activities, learn a wide variety of new techniques and experience a wonderful time of fellowship while enjoying our great hobby.

The Convention will officially open on Wednesday, September 7th with registration,



a PSR Board Meeting and clinics. That evening we will gather for a special reception with light refreshments at the world-famous San Diego Model Railroad Museum.

On Thursday, September 8th, the day will begin with our annual PSR Membership Meeting and complimentary breakfast. This will be followed by a full day of new clinics, layout tours, prototype tours, operating sessions, and non-rail activities. The evening will close with exciting games of Bingo for Trains.

Friday, September 9th will continue with the same type of activities with the notable addition of two very large model railroad auctions. The first is our traditional Hobo Auction where we anticipate more than two hundred items to bid on. The second will be a silent auction for more exclusive model railroad items.

The Hobo Breakfast will kick off Saturday, September 10th followed by a large model railroad swap meet which is free to venders who bring their own tables and convention registrants. Later in the morning, the swap meet will be open for paid admission to the public with children under twelve free. All the regular convention activities will continue throughout the day. That evening we will gather to enjoy our annual Awards and Recognition Banquet with famous radio and TV celebrity Shotgun Tom Kelly as our MC.

Sunday, September 11th is the last day of the Convention and will offer more home & club layout tours throughout the County.

As you can see, it will be a full week of model railroading enjoyment. If you have not yet registered and booked a room, I would encourage you to do it today (www.psrconvention.org) Hope to see you there!

to be held in Long Beach, CA, August 4th-11th, 2024.


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Director's Report

FORMAT: Roundtable style, very informal, no agenda ...via the Zoom app



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How To...

Life Beyond the Layout





I didn't have room to model the entire Pacific Steamship Co.'s wharf, so I put this sign up to let visitors know what was missing, and to prevent cars from falling to the floor. I don't want to claim ownership of this idea, but I did want to pass it along for those who haven't seen it done before.

I have a few locations on the layout where I had to cut the track off before a natural stopping point. Rather than having the track stop at the edge of the layout without an explanation, I decided to put a little bit of information on a piece of clear plastic.

This serves two purposes. 1) It keeps trains from driving off the edge of the layout. 2) It lets visitors know where that track goes. This helps add a bit to the realism, giving the trains an additional sense of purpose on where they're headed (even if there isn't room to get there).

This is an easy addition, keeps things safe, and lets your visitors envision the world just outside of the layout's edge.

New Feature! LA Division Backshop

OK, you've joined or are considering joining the National Model Railroad Association and I guess the question is: why? I doubt that you joined to help consolidate the model railroad standards that the NMRA is famous for and that we all benefit from. Nor do I think you joined solely for the subscription to the great little monthly NMRA magazine or our LA Division Coupler newsletter. If you are like most model railroaders, you joined or are thinking about joining to see if membership could enhance the enjoyment of the little spare time set aside for your model railroading hobby.

If you are like most modelers, you enjoy making or operating your models and many of us enjoy doing this in somewhat of a "vacuum". We model away, have a look at what we accomplished and it puts a smile on our face and renews our desire to repeat the efforts to enhance and continue with our modeling. Typically, joining any hobby association is a direct response to this desire to make the experience more fulfilling- It can and does, for many.

The catch is that simply joining an association and not taking advantage of what the association has to offer does little to enhance anything. OK, you get the magazine but is read in an hour or two and that alone will not usually produce the desired hobby enhancement a modeler is looking for.

The modeling experience enhancement you may be looking for in joining a hobby association comes directly from the interaction with other like-minded modelers. In our case: model railroaders. If you think that looking at what you have accomplished or are contemplating doing by yourself brings enjoyment to your spare time, consider what it is like to have someone else appreciated what you have done. "What a great model" goes a long way to adding to that smile and also opens up the door for more interaction and more interest. It's simple, it's easy and it is right there. All you have to do to magnify your model railroading experience is to take advantage of what is already offered.

The NMRA is a unique association in that it is broken up into small relatively manageable groups called Divisions. Ours is the Los Angeles Division. With less than 200 members our group is comfortable, friendly and interesting. It is not possible to attend one of our meetings and not make friends that you will see again at a following meet with even the smallest of effort. If you don't talk to anyone, it won't work but just make a comment about any model railroad subject to anyone at the meet and off you go.

LA Division Backshop

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For many of us already through the initial stages of membership, the social side of the hobby comes to be a significant contributor to the enjoyment of the hobby. Don't take the "Social" to mean exclusive in any form because it is not. All model railroaders that join the association are open for conversation and interaction with anyone with a desire to share. It is in the nature of the model railroader.

If you really want to expand your hobby, consider expanding the "social" side. There are at least two easy and fun ways to do this. The first is obvious. Get involved. Just give it a try. If you noticed in our last issue of the LA Division Coupler, there are several "managerial" positions open. These are not 40 hour/week jobs. Many require less than an hour or two per month but the big payback is that you automatically become a member of a small group of really fun model railroader individuals that meet once a month as a group to keep the Division on track to have fun. If you can contribute or can learn how to contribute to one of these functions and have a desire to try it, it is a simple matter of letting anyone listed on the Team, Committees and Chairs list in the Coupler, at any time, and it will get to our Superintendent, Vic Cavalli. He will contact you directly to discuss your interest level and area.

The second easy way to expand your hobby with the NMRA, if you don't want to spend even an hour or two on a zoom meet, is to get involved with the modeling side of the hobby. Again, you have to come to our meets, but this is where the modeling side comes out. There are usually great clinics that you can attend to learn new modeling techniques and you can interact with like-minded modelers. Or consider presenting a clinic yourself. In parallel to this is the models themselves. Most of our Divisional and Regional meets feature a model showcase room. You can bring models to the meet for others to appreciate and learn from your modeling and you can see what others have done. Sometimes a short "Show and Tell" session is added to really get some of the modeling details.

The NMRA has a program especially designed to enhance the model railroad hobby for the model railroad modeler. By that, I mean those individuals that enjoy building models. It doesn't matter if the models are kits, scratch built or detailed commercial models, scenery on a module, laying track or running wires. This program is called the NMRA Achievement Program or "AP" for short.

Just as the Boy Scouts have their "Eagle" program, the AP has it "Master Model Railroader" program. Similar again to the Scouts Merit Badge awards, the AP has "Achievement Awards". There are only 11 of them and earning seven earns you the title. Achieving the MMR title is not the goal, but the reward, for having experienced a significant amount of modeling fun and having contributed in some small way to the hobby enjoyment by others. Each Achievement Award is an accomplishment in itself and something you can be proud of.

If you want to look into the NMRA AP program, simply go the NMRA web site and follow you nose around the "Achievement Program" tab or catch me at any Division or Region meet or on one of the Cajon Connection zoom groups offered each month.

In any case, the rewards for your membership will magnify if you simply "Get Involved" at any level. Just give it a try.
